IRISH CATHOLIC NEWSPAPER

For a while now the Parish Team and Parish Pastoral Council have been conscious of the cost of the Irish Catholic Newspaper to the parish. Each week the parish gets 30 copies of the Irish Catholic, at a cost of €2 per copy. This is for 50 weeks of the year. A total cost of €3000. Up to now this cost has been borne by the parish finances and the paper distributed free of charge. Most parishes charge for the paper, some ask for a donation. In some parishes parishioners sign on to receive it each week – order it, in effect.

The Mission of the Irish Catholic paper is: to be a voice for Catholics, faithfully present and promote the Faith and highlight in a thought-provoking manner, the religious, social and moral issues of the day that affect our readers and the broader faith community. And in this regard the Irish Catholic performs a very important function for people in the Irish Church.

We do not in any way wish to discourage people from getting the paper but we also would like to lighten the financial subsidy of the parish towards it.

So what we propose to those who get the paper, is an invitation to contribute towards its cost each week. As a guide – the Irish Catholic costs the parish €2 per copy per week. A box will be left beside the paper for contributions.

The parish will continue to provide the Mass leaflet with its front page reflection; Reality Magazine and The Sacred Heart Messenger free of charge. These along with the Irish Catholic are provided as a contribution towards reflection and nourishment of our faith.
