Journeying Together - Challenges Facing the Migrant Today

'Journeying Together - Challenges Facing the Migrant Today', is the theme of a conference which will be jointly hosted by the Bishops' Councils for Immigrants and Emigrants on Wednesday 19 February in Dublin city centre.



The conference will celebrate the 10th anniversary of *Erga Migrantes Caritas Christi*. It will also provide a unique opportunity to explore both emigration and immigration in an Irish, European and global context. The conference workshops will offer forums to discuss the effects of migration on the undocumented, families, prisoners and trafficking.



Speakers at the conference will include Archbishop Diarmuid Martin, Archbishop of Dublin, who will deliver the keynote address; Mr Stefan Kessler, Policy and Advocacy Officer for the Jesuit Refugee Service, Europe; and, Ms Cecilia Taylor-Camara, Senior Policy Adviser, Office for Migration Policy of the Catholic Church in England and Wales. Archbishop Eamon Martin addressed the Ballymena Borough Church Members' Forum with Dr Heather Morris, President of the Methodist Church in Ireland on 4 February last. He said: "I think we in the Churches have a particular responsibility to lead the way in transforming relationships and in healing the pain of the past. Perhaps one way in which we could do this would be to develop a 'covenant of friendship' between our Churches at leadership level and offer support to our local congregations and parishes in developing similar 'covenants' at local level." - Full address on catholicbishops.ie.

World Day of the Sick 2014

The 22nd World Day of the Sick will be celebrated on Tuesday 11 February - the memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes. This year's message from Pope Francis is on the theme 'Faith and Charity: "We Ought to Lay Down Our Lives for One Another" (1 Jn 3:16).'

In his message Pope Francis says: "I turn in a special way to the sick and all those who provide them with assistance and care. The Church recognises in you, the sick, a special presence of the suffering Christ. It is true. At the side of - and indeed within - our suffering, is the suffering of Christ; he bears its burden with us and he reveals its meaning."
