Using the Irish Catholic Catechism for Adults in your parish

We all know September is the time when children go back to school, and the familiar routine of learning starts once again. Nowadays, this is also true for many adults who have decided to further their own education, either formally or informally. This month, the Irish Church has a new resource for those who wish to deepen their understanding of their own faith. The *Irish Catholic Catechism for Adults* presents to all Irish Catholics a renewed opportunity to study, reflect on and to live by the faith we profess. Many parishes have already discovered how fruitful it can be for adults to come together, as a living faith community, to discuss this new catechism, which has been written specifically for the Irish context. To date useful approaches have included:

- Organise a three, four or five week study group in the evening, focusing on selected chapters from the Catechism;
- Start a catechism study group one day a week after morning Mass; and/or
- Select chapters from the Catechism relevant to the celebration of particular sacraments, and discuss them with those preparing to celebrate these sacraments.

On 8 September, the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Pope



Francis accepted the resignation of His Eminence Cardinal Seán Brady as Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland. This decision by the Holy Father means that Archbishop Eamon Martin (52) became the 116th Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland in succession to Saint Patrick. ICPO launches "It's good to know before you go" campaign



The campaign emphasises the importance of being aware of cultural differences and of adhering to local laws and customs, while also raising awareness of ICPO's services so that emigrants who get into difficulty are aware of the supports available, to themselves and others.
