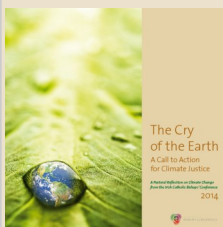
Synod of Bishops begins in Rome on *The Pastoral Challenges of the Family in the Context of Evangelisation*



Archbishop Diarmuid Martin, Archbishop of Dublin, will represent the Irish Catholic Bishops' Conference at the Third Extraordinary General Assembly of Bishops which will take place at the Vatican from 5 to 19 October to discuss the topic: *The Pastoral Challenges of the Family in the Context of Evangelisation*. Speaking ahead of the synod Archbishop Martin said: "The challenge posed by Pope Francis for the upcoming Synod of Bishops is to be open to ways of applying the primacy of mercy to particular

situations while remaining faithful to fundamental truth." Bishops ask for the prayerful support of the faithful to guide the Synod fathers and recommend the prayer from Pope Francis to the Holy Family.
