Address of Pope Francis for conclusion of Synod of Bishops



Speaking in October at the conclusion of the well publicised Third Extraordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, Pope Francis said: "With a heart full of appreciation and gratitude I want to thank, along with you, the Lord who has accompanied and guided us in the past

days, with the light of the Holy Spirit. I can happily say that – with a spirit of collegiality and of synodality – we have truly lived the experience of 'Synod', a path of solidarity, a 'journey together.' And it has been 'a journey' – and like every journey there were moments of running fast, as if wanting to conquer time and reach the goal as soon as possible; other moments of fatigue, as if wanting to say 'enough'; other moments of enthusiasm and ardour. There were moments of profound consolation listening to the testimony of true pastors, who wisely carry in their hearts the joys and the tears of their faithful people. Moments of consolation and grace and comfort hearing the testimonies of the families who have participated in the Synod and have shared with us the beauty and the joy of their married life."
