Dublin have welcomed the publication of *Amoris Laetitia (The Joy of Love, on love in the family)* the post-synodal Apostolic Exhortation from Pope Francis which was published on 8 April. Speaking at the launch in Archbishop's House, Dublin, Archbishop Eamon said: "the document has a warm, distinctive and familiar style that speaks to the reality of ordinary life. It is very much in tune with the concrete realities

of everyday life as lived by married couples and families. The document reflects the vision of Pope Francis in that we cannot resort to doctrine without considering the complexities of married life. The content is also challenging, and includes a call for all of us to reflect on how we live our lives."

Archbishop Diarmuid Martin said: "Amoris Laetitia is an encyclopaedic document and like all encyclopaedic documents much of its most valuable content runs the risk of being by-passed by a preoccupation with one or two of its aspects. All of this is situated within a process which began in 2014 when Pope Francis asked bishops around the world to consult with their own priests and lay men and women on the situation of the family today. That process continued with the celebration of two sessions of the Synod of Bishops. Each of these Synods produced its own Report which was published at the time. These Reports constitute the backbone of the Pope's document. But the document is also full of very personal reflections of Pope Francis. Amoris Laetitia reflects faithfully the thoughts of the Synod and it is yet completely infused with the original pastoral style of Pope Francis".
