Ricardo Navarrete Gutiérrez (Mexico) writes: "The great St Augustine, in his Confessions, stated that the past and future are not moments that have ceased to exist or have not yet come into existence. They are rather part of our present through our memories and our expectations and hopes of things to come (Cf. XI, 23-26). The same could be said of us Marists: Our present exists within a memory built upon a divinelyinspired charism, and a future full of faith and hope reflected in the prophetic words of Mary: "I supported the Church at its birth; I shall do so again at the end of time" (SM Constitutions 2). This time of preparation for us seven Marist students, was led by former superior general, Fr John Hannan. Two main concepts opened the door for us to believing in a future full of life. The first one was our Marist memory: We went on a pilgrimage to the places where the founder and his first companions preached and prayed. We were thus able to draw upon the spiritual inheritance they left us. The second concept was the faith-based future expectations for the congregation shared with us by the presenters. As we stood around our founder's tomb, coming as we did from many different cultures and continents, we wondered, did Fr Colin ever think that the congregation would join together people from so many different parts of the globe? Our pilgrimage through the places of Marist origins was a catalyst... we see now a new perspective that will allow us to respond faithfully to Mary's call to us today." 












GREETINGS FROM PARIS!
