REVIEW OF THE EXPERIENCE OF WELCOMING PILGRIMS ON THE CAMINO, SAHAGÚN, SPAIN, 12-13 JANUARY





Pilgrims travel along the Camino de Santiago de Compostela throughout the year, yet the pilgrimage season gets going in earnest around March and then slows down in November. In 2018, the province began a ministry of hospitality and accompaniment of pilgrims in Sahagún, located exactly at the half-way point along the French Camino. The confreres Daniel Fernández (Esp), Toño Fernández (Esp) and Andrea Volonnino (It) welcomed 3,333 pilgrims during the 2018 season, working in collaboration with the Benedictine sisters at the pilgrims' hostel (Albergue de Peregrinos de la Santa Cruz) (www.alberguesensahagun.es). The hostel aims to be an oasis of peace and spirituality. During the off-season, Daniel and Toño reviewed the experiences of last season with Martin McAnaney and Marcello Pregno and with the assistance of Francisco Chauvet (Mex) as interpreter. The team offers an invitation to pilgrims to focus on the spiritual dimension of the Camino and reach a greater understanding of the motivation which brought them on the journey in the first place, and the meaning of their experiences along the way. Over a cup of coffee, the team shares the pilgrims' sorrows, their joys, and sometimes their hunger for meaning and for God. Some 40% of pilgrims participate in this conversation over coffee. This is followed by a Mass and a special blessing for the journey. The day is rounded off by a meal in common to which everyone brings something, and 60% join in this activity. By sharing with the pilgrims in this way, the team has discovered that they too are pilgrims. The review showed that the project is going well. Some elements of the programme need to be adapted and the team faces new challenges for the coming year. The province plans to strengthen the community for 2019 season, hoping to offer spiritual hospitality, inspired by the Marist vision, to even more pilgrims. MEETINGS TO CONSIDER THE FUTURE MARIST PRESENCE IN ITALY (15-16 JANUARY) AND THE NETHERLANDS (22 JANUARY)

The reality of the province changes at such a pace it is difficult for us to keep up! During the first half of the 20th century, Marists spread throughout Europe and beyond, as they sought to contribute to the mission of the Church by their presence in particular locations and their involvement in specific apostolic activities. Today our situation is different. Given the changes in the social context and in our circumstances, how do we remain faithful to our vocation to be the Work of Mary today? We need to ask ourselves this question constantly. In Italy, a working group of confreres, Mario Castellucci, Giovanni Danesin, Marcello Pregno and Bruno Rubechini met in September 2018 and again this month, to identify possible future arrangements for Marist life there. Martin McAnaney joined them for this work. An assembly of confreres will take place in Rome next month, to consider the fruit of their reflections. In the Netherlands, a group of Dutch confreres, Ad Blommerde, Ton Bun, Joop Reurs and Jan ter Braak met twice with Jean-Marie Bloqueau and Martin McAnaney, to address the same question for that country. The Dutch confreres will likewise hold an assembly in May, at which they will receive an update. We may not be able to predict the future exactly but we know we can influence it by the decisions we make today in our efforts to live our Marist vocation faithfully.
