The gathering began with a retreat day where we listened and discerned with Mary in the Upper Room. We shared our experiences, and the hopes and fears of all our confreres and the people whom we serve, and waited upon the Spirit. The theme of the ARC was "the Upper Room". This prayerful, discerning Spirit remained with us through the days. The 2017 Chapter was a particular guide book.

We worked together discussing a way forward for the governance of the Society with a smaller

number of confreres in the years ahead. The Spirit of co-operation, encouragement and fraternity was alive. Helpful models of governance emerged. We discerned "particular ministries" which would help us to direct the special focus of our life and energy as an international Society into the years ahead. At the same time we would continue to make our present contribution locally as best as we reasonably could. There were sessions on formation too, especially international formation. We gave attention to on-going formation especially for the several years after Perpetual Profession up until the time of the Colinian renewal. We also considered our finances and other special concerns.
