THE GENERAL HOUSE REDUCES ITS CARBON FOOTPRINT



The light fixtures in the chapel and exterior of the General House, after more than twenty years, had to be replaced because so many were no longer operational or functioning at significantly reduced levels. The light fixtures in the chapel were replaced with energy-efficient LED units. The new fittings provide significantly greater illumination but need 80% less energy. The exterior floodlights were also replaced with LED fixtures. The new light system has improved the lighting for better security - eliminating the many shadowed areas. The lights are programmable and are so efficient that they operate at 50% capacity for the early evening hours and are reduced to 30% capacity from 11:00 pm until dawn. The cost of these replacements will be recovered in approximately six years. Some possible future projects to reduce the carbon footprint of the General House are the use of rainwater for irrigation and installation of solar panels.

INTERRELIGIOUS MEETING IN RANONG, THAILAND

Last month the Marist Center community in Ranong, Thailand, celebrated the World Interfaith Harmony Week. It was initiated by the Marist Commission for Interreligious Dialogue and Reconciliation (MCIRD). It was an opportunity for a reflection on the richness of the diversity in the center. Most are Buddhists but there are also Christians and Muslims. One of the students commented that this celebration was "one of the ways where we can tell the world that diversities of cultures and religions enriches us all."
