## MARIST YOUTH LEADER PROGRAM

One hundred and thirty-five students and over forty teaching staff gathered last week at Hato Pāora College on the North Island, New Zealand. 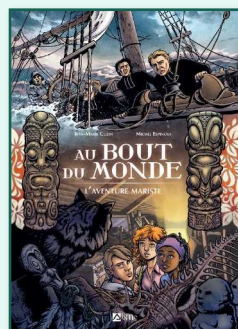
## GENERAL ADMINISTRATION
