The icon was painted especially for this occasion by iconographer Mr. Daan Hensens."

Year of Vocations

On 15 November the Marist Vocation Year will be launched. The *Think Tank for vocations* is preparing this year, and has now launched the logo.

Central is the <u>Marian monogram</u>, referring both to Mary and to the Society.

The letters are set in a circle, symbolizing the fullness of life. The vocations year is not only about seeking religious vocations but also enriching, encouraging and assisting both confreres and young people in their search for the fullness of life promised by the Lord.

The crescent moon, as in Patristic tradition, refers to the *mysterium lunae*: dying (waning), generating (waxing) and giving birth (full moon). Mary as the God-bearer is identified with the Church, called to be maternal and life-giving.



The crescent moon also represents a <u>net</u>, referring to our call to be fishers of people. The flame represents the Holy Spirit coming down on us.
