Covid 19

You need no reminder from us about the potential danger from the Delta variant of Covid 19. It is all over the news. The numbers of positive infections is rising, among the younger age groups and those not vaccinated. This is also beginning to show in the rising numbers who are hospitalised and in ICU. We need now to protect those who are not yet vaccinated – mostly though not exclusively among the younger age group. We need therefore to continue to follow all the health guidance:

Reminder of Covid-19 measures for our safety:

- Max. number of 90 people
- two meter social distancing
- wearing a mask
- sanitizing of hands in and out
- communion in the pew
- do not kneel if there is a person in front
- take the mass leaflet home with you or dispose of it in the bin at the exits.
- use the one way system entrance/exit.

Mass is still available online for those who feel safer to stay at home.

July – August: There is no Monday evening mass. Live instrumental music will continue at all weekend masses.

Funerals: Maximum number: 50. On request from the family, funeral services can be recorded via the webcam. This recording will be kept for one week.

Baptisms: We have baptisms on the first and third Saturday of the month, under certain circumstances. We are booked up until October. All families who have bookings are being contacted to ensure that they are aware of the restrictions under which we can hold baptisms.

PARISH IN THE PANDEMIC BOOK

Parish life from January 2020 to May 2021 was heavily marked by the Covid-19 pandemic with no public mass, and many other sacrifices people had to make. The Parish Pastoral Council appointed an editorial team to gather the material we have produced during the pandemic, our response as parish, and to select material for a book project. We appreciate the contribution of the Muslim community in Ireland and pray that the Merciful and Compassionate God will guide, bless and protect them during this important expression of their faith.
