The Marist Mission Centre in Ranong recently granted a university scholarship to two young Burmese migrant teachers. Both are graduates of the Marist Education Programme in Ranong. They will study a 4 year Bachelor of Education at Asia Pacific International University in Bangkok, Thailand. The scholarship is funded by the Marist Asia Foundation, the Marist Mission Centre (Australia) and the provinces of the USA and New Zealand. Also the Sunday Migrant Worker Classes for Thai, English and computer are starting. As students are not allowed in classes because of the pandemic, the Marist Mission Centre started with online classes. Two weeks ago, the new students were welcomed to register and download google meet and google classroom to begin their learning online. Most students have left school at a young age to support their families. By following the classes, they can develop computer and language skills, and have more employment choices for a brighter future.
