GOLDEN JUBILEE OF THE PACIFIC REGIONAL SEMINARY

In 1968 the Pacific Bishops Conference (CEPAC) was established and Fr George Pearce sm was elected its first president. To allow seminarians to do their studies within the Pacific, in 1972 he established the Pacific Regional Seminary of St. Peter Chanel in Suva, Fiji, and promptly bishops and congregations recalled their students from Australia and New Zealand to join the new seminary. Marist confrere James Ross, who was the secretary to CEPAC, was nominated the first rector.

To mark the Golden jubilee of the Seminary, during three days this week a series of celebrations and meetings were organised under the theme "Forming a Synodal Church". The festivities started with a Eucharist presided by Bishop Paul Donoghue sm who is the president of CEPAC.
