ALTAR FLOWERS IN LENT

As a space for prayer, the church reflects the changing seasons of the liturgical year. So,

over the weeks in Lent, the Sanctuary and Altar will take on a less decorated/ornate appearance with no flowers, in keeping with the simplicity of Lent. The exception to this will be St Patrick's weekend. The various shrines around the church will continue to be decorated with some flowers. Holy Thursday and the Holy Saturday night will see the re-emergence of altar flowers.

Last Thursday, the parish team organised a meeting with local funeral directors. The main item on the agenda was "Funeral Services" as distinct from "Funeral Masses". It is important for families to know that at the time of a funeral for a loved one, there is the option of a funeral service in the parish church as an alternative to a funeral mass. Not all families wish to have a funeral mass. We will distribute more information about this in the coming weeks.

Similarly, the Sacraments of Marriage and Confirmation can be held within a Marriage Service and Confirmation Service, rather than within a Eucharist / Mass. This is all a reflection of the changing times where many profess a faith, a prayer life, and a spirituality while at the same time, feel detached from the Mass and do not RISH DONORE 1 NFO
